

Britt Marie Ljung, MD, Pathologist, University of California San Francisco

Dr. Ljung is professor and vice chair of Department Pathology at the University of California San Francisco. She is director of the cytopathology training program, co-director of the division of cytopathology and the Director of the UCSF Helen Diller Family Comprehensive Cancer Center Tissue Core Facility. Her clinical work is focused on cytopathology diagnostic methods, including fine-needle aspiration (FNA) and exfoliative cytology. She has collaborated on various projects investigating breast disease focused primarily on chromosome changes in early disease such as hyperplasia and carcinoma in situ. Dr Ljung has published and lectured extensively in the areas of FNA cytology and breast disease. She is a member of the National Comprehensive Cancer Network (NCCN) breast panel and participated on the Breast Health Global Initiative (BHGI) diagnosis panel for the writing of guidelines for management of breast disease in low and middle income settings at the 2007 meeting in Budapest. She participated in the BHGI sponsored course in breast health care in Kumasi, Ghana 2010. During the course she directed practical training in FNA technique followed by implementation of FNA diagnosis for a variety of conditions including breast lesions at the Komfo Anokye Teaching Hospital (KATH) in Kumasi.
